LÜBECK

- Independent from any king
- In the 14th century right to mint
- The strongest and biggest Hanseatic city, in Germany, of the 14th century
- As the result of big warfunding they lost their reputation









Red and white are the typical and traditional colours of the Hanseatic blazon



BREMEN

- Became a Hanseatic city in 1260, but was not a reliable alliance partner
- A strong economic city at the peak of the Hansa
- The Roland and the old townhall are memorials of the independence from the church, which was reached with the help of the Hansa





WISMAR

- Wismar was founded in 1226, it has been a Hanseatic city since its foundation
- Alliance with Lübeck and Rostock against piracy
- Old Hanseatic traditions last until today
